Inter agency co-ordination meeting of central & state law enforcement agencies

On March 22, 2024, Bengal Safari hosted a significant inter-agency coordination meeting facilitated by the Wildlife Crime Control Bureau, Eastern Region, under the aegis of the Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change, Government of India. This assembly united central and state law enforcement agencies alongside the collaboration of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) from North Bengal, West Bengal Forest Department. This unified endeavor represents a pivotal





stride in combating wildlife crime and upholding biodiversity in the region. Through the consolidation of resources, expertise, and jurisdiction, these agencies aspire to bolster enforcement measures and protect invaluable ecosystems and endangered species. This joint strategy underscores a dedication to wildlife conservation and emphasizes the necessity of collaborative endeavors in addressing environmental dilemmas.

Bio-security measures taken in the month of March



In addition to regular care, the park has implemented comprehensive monthly biosecurity measures. This includes disinfectant spraying in and around each enclosure, sterilization using blow flame application in every animal night shelter, and necessary vaccinations administered to animals by veterinarians.


